
BACKGROUND

- TESTAY IS AN ISOLATED VILLAGE, 6 HOURS BY ROAD FROM SHIGAR, LAST VILLAGE BEFORE THE START OF THE MIGHTY BIAFO GLACIER
- 120 HOUSEHOLDS AND 720 CHILDREN. VERY LOW LITERACY RATE
- SUBSISTENCE ECONOMY RELIES ON WHEAT PRODUCTION, LIVESTOCK AND SEASONAL WORK AS PORTERS
- SMALL GOVERNMENT SCHOOL WITH 2 TEACHERS AND 2 VOLUNTEERS. MANY OUT OF SCHOOL CHILDREN. HIGH DROPOUT RATES. ONE TEACHER PER HUNDRED STUDENTS
- LIMITED TEACHING AIDS AND FACILITIES (TOILETS, WATER SUPPLY, ELECTRICITY)
- LOW PARTICIPATION BY WOMEN WHO MAINLY WORK IN THE FIELDS AND UNDERTAKE HOUSEHOLD DUTIES
- AVERAGE FAMILY DISPOSABLE INCOME IS VERY LOW
- POOR HYGIENE AWARENESS
- NON FUNCTIONAL ORGANISATIONAL STRUCTURES

TESTAY VILLAGE VISIT

- IN MAY 2024, "COMMUNITIES MATTER" TEAM VISITED TESTAY VILLAGE FOR FOUR DAYS
- CONDUCTED FOCUS GROUP DISCUSSIONS WITH THE NUMBERDAAR, IMAM, VILLAGE ELDERS, YOUTH AND WOMEN
- SPENT TIME AT THE SCHOOL AND LOOKED CLOSELY AT THE STATE OF AGRICULTURE, WATER SUPPLY AND PROVISION
 OF ELECTRICITY TO THE VILLAGE
- APPRISED BOTH THE DEPUTY COMMISSIONER SHIGAR AND DEPUTY DIRECTOR EDUCATION OF THE STATE OF EDUCATION AND OTHER PROBLEMS THE VILLAGERS ENCOUNTER ON A DAILY BASIS
- BRAINSTORMED WAYS OF EMPOWERING THE VILLAGERS TO NAVIGATE THEIR LIVES EFFECTIVELY
- DISCUSSED WITH THE GOVERNMENT HOW THEY CAN ASSIST US IMPROVE VILLAGE LIVELIHOOD





- LACK OF TEACHERS / POOR LEADERSHIP
- NO ELECTRICITY IN SCHOOL

- LACK OF ACCESS TO CLEAN DRINKING WATER






WHAT WE PLAN TO DO
