REPORT ON CAPACITY BUILIDNG WORKSHOP FOR NASIR-I- KHISROW ACADEMY TEACHERS GOJAL HUNZA

Introduction

A weeklong workshop for the capacity building of Nasir-i-Khisrow Academy teachers Gojal, Hunza was organized from March 8-12, 2021. This workshop facilitated overall 10 teachers, including two male and eight female teachers. This report presents the whole activities carried out as per scheduled weeklong plan. It highlights the aim of the workshop, its' objectives, workshop outcomes and teachers' evaluation regarding the workshop. A conclusion is made at the end of the report to augment the gained learning during the whole processes.

Aim of the Workshop

The weeklong course aimed at developing teachers' professional competencies and enable them to perform their roles more effectively and professionally. Overall, the course focused on presenting a wider perspective of teachers' profession so that they can play their effective roles in improving students' learning outcomes in various grades.

Specific Objectives

Specifically, the objectives were designed to help the participants where they could:

- ► Improve their understanding regarding language and communication
- ▶ Broaden their perspectives pertaining to school leadership by integration Monitoring and Evaluation Framework for various activities
- ▶ Develop clearer understanding regarding lesson planning and devise certain model plans distinguishing the learning needs of the students
- ▶ Recognize the notion of classroom management and learn the skills to organize a learning-effective classroom
- ► Familiarize themselves with different stages of classroom observation
- ▶ Develop understanding regarding feedback, its phases and implications for students learning
- ► Improve their understanding regarding library management
- ► Conceptualize various innovative teaching methodologies, particularly the use of technology in teaching and learning processes
- ▶ Improve their reflective practices by being involved in reflective sessions

Workshop Themes

To develop various content knowledge and teaching skills, the following themes were carried out during the weeklong course:

• Language and Communication

- Students' learning needs in 21st century
- School leadership and Ethical leadership
- Educational Monitoring and Evaluation
- Lesson Planning, the what and how of lesson planning
- Classroom Observation and Feedback
- Classroom Management and Various dimensions of classroom management
- Students' Assessment, Purpose and different types of Assessment
- Teaching & Learning with Technology (Innovative Pedagogies)
- Library Skills Development

Applied Teaching and Learning Methods

The weeklong course focused the following teaching and learning strategies to involve the course participants in learning processes:

- Group and class discussions to engage the participants in exploring their understanding and experiences, i.e. brainstorming, individual, group and pair work activities
- Group presentations
- Practical work to deepen participants' understanding in various themes
- Using Audio-visual sources pertaining to various themes
- Critical feedback by the course participants and facilitators
- Whole class and individual questions
- Independent learning by guided tasks

Workshop Outcomes

Generally, the themes selected for the weeklong workshop seemed quite appealing and pertinent for the teachers. The following successes/outcomes were drawn by analyzing the course evaluations, formal discussions with CPs, informal observations and CPs reflections:

- Language and communication is one of the leading barriers for the teachers teaching
 in various schools. The session on language and communication remained
 instrumental in developing their understanding and fluency in various language areas,
 particularly the phonics and communication.
- The theme on students' needs in 21st century and role of school leadership informed the participants about what different roles the school leaders can play to address the needs of the students, studying in current era.
- Monitoring and evaluation for students learning activities provided the participants an
 overall view of the successful implementation of the initiatives pertaining to students
 learning and how school leadership can make it happen.
- The session on classroom observation and feedback, and classroom management invited the participants to reflect on their practices related to their observation mechanisms and management of their routine classes. These sessions assisted them to modify their existing practices and convert their classes towards most attractive learning ones.
- Lesson planning was an attractive addition for improving teachers' competencies. The presentation and practical work using various syllabi textbooks developed participants' understanding on developing plans tailored with students' needs.
- Students' assessment invited the participants to reflect on their existing practices
 pertaining to students' assessment at school. Different types of assessment using
 multiple tools added participants' understanding on carrying out real assessment
 procedures to improve students' learning.
- Library skills development in the contemporary world was quite new theme for the
 course participants. The session on library management and practical approaches
 using low/no-cost materials helped the participants to develop various skills, needed
 to increase their existing library literature sources, maintain stock register and booksissuing practices.
- The session on innovative pedagogies, particularly technology-integrated teaching helped the participants to re-align their teaching with modern needs. In this regard, the

- presentation and practical work through using various search engines and learning sites enhanced participants know how about using technology in their teaching.
- The most important achievement of the program was the profound positive change in course participants' attitudes. In this regard, certain themes conducted by four of the faculty members and librarian remained highly inspiring to motivate the participants in various areas of school improvement.
- Through frequent reflective sessions, the teachers came to know about the importance of reflections for teachers and its important role for enhancing teaching and learning processes.
- Throughout the course, the participants were encouraged to search the literature through utilization of library books and internet. They were also provided certain opportunities to integrate the new learning with various activities. This approach ultimately remained highly effective in capturing new ideas and to know about the developments made in the field of education.
- Overall, the weeklong course focusing on improving professional competencies of teachers provided ample opportunities for the participants to improve their conceptual understanding, and capacities needed to bring positive improvement reforms in their respective school. In this regard, all the course participants' course evaluations and discourses were quite inviting, as they shared their beautiful learning experiences during the weeklong training course.

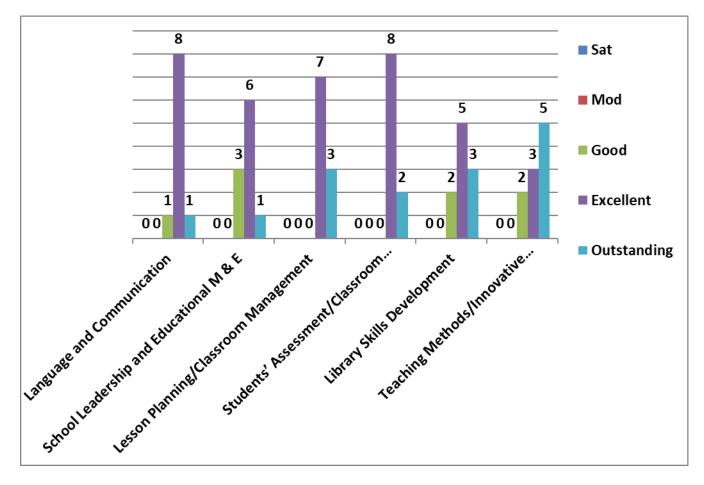

Reflection about CPs Analysis

Course participants' evaluations show an appealing picture. The overall data shows that course participants rated all the themes mostly (25%) in outstanding scale, followed by excellent (62%) category. Additionally, the table shows only (13%) in good scale, while none of the CPs rated any themes in satisfactory and moderate levels. Their theme ratings clearly depict out that the content and the activities being carried out during the weeklong course were matched with the needs of the participants.

Challenges and Recommendations

As the course was carried out in one week only, hence to facilitate more themes (as requested) in shorter period of time remained a constant challenge. To overcome this challenge, the facilitators applied different approaches by assigning certain home tasks for the participants. This approach helped in utilization of time more efficiently and productively and the objectives of the workshop were met effectively.

Conclusion

The workshop arranged for the teachers of Nasir-i-Khisrow Academy Gojal, Hunza remained inspiring for the respective teachers in content and pedagogical areas in general and to improve their aptitudes. The overall course evaluations, and formal and informal discourses with the course participants revealed that it has brought a visible change, needed for their profession. For instance, it has improved the multi-dimensional content areas needed for school improvement at one end, while it has also remained effective in developing the pedagogical skills at the other end. By analyzing the overall structure of the course and course participants' deeper involvement and feelings shared during the activities, it can be established that the teachers' expectations have been met with higher standards. To add additional skills, there is need to arrange similar courses in content-specific and pedagogical aspects, needed to improve students' learning outcomes in the said school. Such continuity of courses not only improve their aptitudes, but also become instrumental in bridging the various content and pedagogy-based issues prevailing in their system school.
